The project aims to develop a toolbox of Web-based self-help programs for handling such stress and aggression in soldiers returning from the war effort. Every year approximately repatriated. 3000 soldiers from the military effort in Afghanistan. There are too many cases where a large psychological and social shifts that are difficult to handle and provides many large and small problems. To function in civilian life after their return there must be a mental reorientation towards a more normal life that does not require a high level of mental preparedness, and to some of the returnees be working stressful experiences.

Soldiers who do not get created a mental reorientation is in danger of getting into trouble over the handling of personal life, family and work. At worst, a lack of mental reorientation result in self-destruction, divorce and personal financial problems and a lack of labor market attachment. The project aims to develop a toolbox of Web-based self-help programs for stress management, aggression, anxiety, depression and sleep problems among demobilized soldiers. Toolkit, together with support from a psychologist or a psychiatric nurse, helping to increase prosperity for the returning soldiers. The challenge of mental reorientation of the returning soldiers may be related to the five problem areas: • stress reduction • Reduction of aggression • Managing anxiety • Handling

Additionally, the project will be developed a set of screening tools that will make it possible to individualize assistance to individual soldiers, so they can see the right combination of help options.
